Placing Membership

The membership of a congregation can be a topic of some confusion and even some controversy. In this brief article, give consideration to the topic of church membership. Some guiding questions are these. What is meant by church membership? Is the issue of church membership important? What does the Bible teach about this subject? As always, the Bible is the only source for trustworthy answers.

One of the first realizations concerns the church which Jesus purchased with the shedding of His blood. (Acts 20:28) When an individual obeys the gospel by belief, repentance, confession, and baptism, that individual is added by Jesus to the church. (Acts 2:47) In particular, that individual, upon scriptural baptism, is in Christ, is saved from sin, and equivalently a member of the church. (Galatians 3:26f; 1 Corinthians 12:13; 1 Pet. 3:21; Rom. 6:17f; Eph. 5:23) In order to be saved, all responsible individuals must be a member of the church.

Given the previous comments, what does the Bible teach about local church membership. It is the will of God that Christians work and serve in a local congregation; in other words, God expects Christians to place membership with a local church and to labor in that body of believers. Right after he became a Christian, Paul sought to “*join himself to the disciples*” in Jerusalem. (Acts 9:26) Due to his reputation, they were hesitant to accept Paul, but Barnabas aided in overcoming the reluctance. (Acts 9:27f) The fact remains that Paul desired to be identified as part of the Jerusalem congregation, to place membership with that group of believers.

To the church in Rome, Paul gave instruction for them to “*be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another.*” (Romans 12:10) This text speaks of a group of people who direct kind affection to one another and who prefer each other in an association sense. Obviously, visitors and strangers are welcome in the assemblies of the church; yet, this text speaks of *one another* and even preferring *one another*. These to be preferred are one’s fellow members of the local congregation. The easiest way to appreciate this passage is to consider membership in the local congregation.

Finally, elders are commanded to “*feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof.*” (1 Pet. 5:2) An eldership watches for the souls of the individuals in their watch. (Heb. 13:17) This consideration is one of the strongest ones teaching the scripturalness of church membership. How does an elder know what souls to feed and for what souls he will give answer? The answer is those souls who are identified with the congregation over which he serves as an elder.

Placing membership with a local congregation identifies a person’s intent to serve beneath the elders of that congregation and to use his/her talents in that congregation to work for the cause of Jesus Christ. It is God’s will that each Christian be a member of a local congregation.
