GIGO

GIGO is an acronym used by computer programmers. It means "garbage in – garbage out". In other words, the results obtained from a computer are only good as the data put into it. We can make personal application of this principle. For instance, everyone has heard the phrase, "you are what you eat", meaning that our physical health is dependent, at least in part, on the food we put into our bodies. If we eat only junk food then our physical health will suffer. If we wish to be healthy then we should eat foods that will promote good health.

There is also a spiritual application that can be made of the "GIGO" principle. If we wish to be the kind of people God wants us to be we must be careful to "input" the proper "data" into our minds. In Philippians 4:8 the Apostle Paul writes, "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy – meditate on these things."

Unfortunately, so much of what we are exposed to these days is "garbage in". Whether music or movies or the mainstream media, much of what we see and hear advocates and glorifies things and actions that are not in accordance with God's will for man. And while it is impossible for us to totally eliminate our exposure to such things, it is important for us to limit how much of these things we see and hear lest we come to see them as "normal".

In Genesis 6:5 we read of God's decision to destroy all mankind because, "...every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually". If we wish to avoid the fate of the world in Noah's day we must be careful not to follow in their steps and control what we put into our minds. "For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace." (Romans 8:6)
