"Take heed how you hear"

At the conclusion of the parable of the sower in Luke 8:18 Jesus says, "take heed how you hear" thus making the point that those represented by the four different kinds of soil in the parable are responsible for the condition of their own hearts.

- In the case of the "wayside soil" it represents one who has no desire to hear or understand the word of God. Satan, represented by the birds in the parable, helps them in their efforts to keep God's word from making any impression on their heart. It is important to note that Satan cannot, "take away the word out of their hearts," without their consent. James 4:7 tells us that if we resist the devil he will flee from us.
- The stony soil represents those who have a purely emotional response to the gospel. Without the firm foundation that a reasoned knowledge of God's word gives, they cannot withstand the trials and persecutions of life.
- The thorny soil represents those who are so preoccupied with the cares of this world, the deceitfulness of riches and the pleasures of life that they have no time or energy left to do God's will. They are the ones the Apostle Peter had reference to in 2 Peter 1:9 as, "shortsighted, even to blindness, and who have forgotten that he was cleansed from his old sins".
- The good ground represents those who not only hear and understand the word but also put it into practice in their lives and "bear fruit".

We are each responsible for the condition of our own heart and we should each, individually, examine our own hearts to see which "soil" we are and "take heed how we hear".

High Anxiety and Blessed Relief

Christians are not completely immune to anxiety. However, as Holy Spirit-filled followers of the will of God, we do have access to a God who cares for us and who will help us cope with this human reality. Consider, for instance, some things that have been discovered about human anxiety. Objective studies indicate that the average person's anxiety is focused on...

- 40% - things that will never happen.
- 30% - things about the past that can't be changed.
- 12% - things about criticism by others, mostly untrue.
- 10% - about health, which gets worse with stress.
- 8% - about real problems that will be faced.

The greatest "real problem" is the reality of sin in the life and the consequences thereof. This is the heaviest burden one can bear. By grace, God gave us Jesus Christ who pleads: "Come to Me, all of you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. All of you, take up My yoke and learn from Me, because I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for yourselves. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light" (Matt. 11:28-30).
